

September 8, 2015 Minutes

The Coffee County Legislative Body met September 8, 2015 in a regular scheduled meeting at the Coffee County Administrative Plaza at 6:00 PM.

Sheriff Steven Graves proclaimed the meeting open for business.

The Invocation was given by Jackie Duncan and the Pledge to the Flag was led by Rush Bricken.

All 21 members were present for the meeting.

Motion made by Kelly and seconded by Shelton to approve the agenda. The motion was approved with 21 yes votes.

Motion made by Kelly and seconded by Walker to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. The motion was approved with 21 yes votes.

Motion made by Bricken and seconded by Duncan to approve the notaries as listed: Bonnie L. Ballard, Tamera Sue Bird, Stacey Booth, Rachel Brown, Eric J. Burch, Paige C. Calahan, Jan R. Motion made by Bryan and seconded by Crockett to elect Mayor Cordell as Chairman. The motion was with 21 yes votes

Motion made by Bricken and seconded by Walker to elect Rosemary Crabtree as Chairman Pro Tem. The motion was approved with 21 yes votes.

Motion made by Shelton and seconded by Morris to elect Joe Pedigo as Parliamentarian. The motion was approved with 21 yes votes

Nominations to the Budget and Finance Committee are Jones from Manchester, Bricken and Kelly from Tullahoma and Bryan and Morris from Rural. Motion made by Walker and seconded by Duncan to elect these nominations to the Budget and Finance Committee. The motion was approved with 19 yes votes. Bryan and Morris abstained.

Nominations for the Legislative Committee are Jones from Manchester, Crabtree and Kelly from Tullahoma and Speer and Bryan from Rural. Motion made by Martin and seconded by Shelton to elect these nominations to the Legislative Committee. The motion was approved with 20 yes votes and Bryan abstained.

Nominations for the Education Committee are Mai from Manchester, Buckner and Crabtree from Tullahoma and Orrick and Deford from Rural. Motion made by Argraves and seconded by Kelly to elect these nominations to the Education Committee. The motion was approved with 19 yes votes. Orrick and Deford abstained.

Nominations for the Health, Welfare and Recreation Committee are Jones from Manchester, Duncan and Martin from Tullahoma and Hunt and Cunningham from Rural. Motion made by Kelly and seconded by Stubblefield to elect these nominations to the Health, Welfare and Recreation Committee. The motion was approved with 18 yes votes. Hunt, Cunningham and Martin abstained.

Nominations for Capital Outlay Committee are Crockett from Manchester, Martin and Bucker from Tullahoma and Shelton and Morris from Rural. Motion made by Kelly and seconded by Farrar to elect these nominations to the Capital Outlay Committee. The motion was approved with 16 yes votes. Crockett, Morris, Shelton, Martin and Buckner abstained.

Nominations for Law Enforcement Committee are Walker from Manchester, Stubblefield and Duncan from Tullahoma and Argraves and Farrar from Rural. Motion made by Morris and seconded by Kelly to elect these nominations to the Law Enforcement Committee. The motion was approved with 17 yes votes. Walker, Farrar, Argraves and Stubblefield abstained.

Motion made by Duncan and seconded by Martin to elect Brent Parsley to the Industrial Board replacing Elmer Morris who resigned because of moving from the City. The motion was approved with 21 yes votes.

Motion made by Bricken and seconded by Stubblefield to approve the following budget amendments: #122-2016-001, #101-2016-002 and #120-2016-003. The motion was approved with 21 yes votes.

Motion made by Kelly and seconded by Crabtree to approve the TRANS letter and the Tax & Revenue Anticipation Note Resolutions. The motion was approved with 21 yes votes.

Motion made by Kelly and seconded by Shelton for the adoption of Resolution 2015-35 to Amend Coffee County Animal control Standard Operating Procedures in regard to Hours of Operation of the Dog Animal Shelter and to Authorize Joint Operation of the Animal Shelter with the City of Manchester. The motion was approved with 21 yes votes.

Brief reports of standing Committees were given, including B & F, Legislative, Education, HWR, Capital Outlay, Law Enforcement and Personnel & Compensation Committee.

Jones announced the Animal Welfare Committee meets every third Monday at 3:00 pm and invites anyone who would want to come speak of any ideas is welcome to do so.

Mayor Cordell presented Marilyn Howard with a Tennessee Governmental Prayer Alliance Proclamation.

Hunt recognized his Mother and Wife for always supporting him by coming to the Commission meeting.

There being no further business the County Legislative Body adjourned.
